The topic **Mobility** plays a central role along the Danube – not only during the International Danube Festival. As one of 15 partners of the EU project Transdanube, the Danube Office has been engaged in this topic since September 2012 aiming at fostering the mobility using ship, train, bus and bike in the Danube Region. Another important field of work is the **Green Economy**, in which the Danube Office evaluates capacities and potentials for the development of "green" products (cultural routes, sports, nature experience) and clean technologies (solar energy, waste/wastewater, e-biking, and point solutions for renewable energy) in the tourism industry on the Danube.

The symposium presents results and perspectives from ongoing and planned projects in the areas of mobility/transport and green economy. Further on, it informs about the current status and future aims of the EU Strategy for the Danube Region and possible funding opportunities for Danube projects.
